


本言総代代 一百年 本 1.5 km Naka Hachiman Shrine Ema (Votive Tablet)

This area, once the prosperous Yayoi kingdom of Nakoku, features large ancient tombs. Walk through 2000 years of history.





the front portion has been lost, estimates state that the mound was 8 meters tall and 80 meters in length at its maximum extent, making it the largest of its kind in the Fukuoka Plain area. Research suggests that it was built in the latter half of the 3rd century. Among the artifacts discovered here are the Shinju-Kyo, or a rare type of deity and beast mirror.




shinage Jizo (The Stone-Throwing Jizo)
